PLAYGROUND SUPERVISION

Dear parents and carers

It's been great to have our students back in classrooms and settling into the school year. I know all our teachers are looking forward to a successful 2024 and are excited to work with you to make this a memorable year for your child.

The evidence is clear that consistent attendance is the essential first step for your child to have a positive experience at school.

Every day matters for your child's learning. In recent years we've seen too many students miss a day of school here and there. Missing school for students means missing assignments, time with friends, an important maths lesson or getting picked for a sports team. With days missed, years are lost.

Students are required to attend school every day, whether it's the first or last day of the term, Mondays, Fridays or days dedicated to sports carnivals, school excursions and incursions.

Help us make sure your child is achieving their best and stays ahead in their learning with regular school attendance. The more time your child attends school, the greater their opportunity to learn, make new friends and improve their wellbeing. Together, let's build positive attendance habits for a lifetime.

If your child is absent from school, please let us know why as soon as possible, even if it's just a few minutes at the start or end of the school day. Of course, there will be times when your child is unable to be at school (like when they are unwell). Medical appointments should take place outside school hours where possible and family holidays should be taken in term breaks.

If your child is feeling anxious about coming to school and you need support, please reach out to your child's teacher or me directly. Our staff are here to work with you and your child to help them attend school each and every day. There are also helpful resources for parents and carers on the Every Day Matters website.

Thank you again for working with our teachers and support staff to make sure your child is at school, on time, every day. We all want to see our students learn, grow and belong in our equitable and outstanding education system.

What is a Real Schools

partnership?

As part of NPS's Strategic School Plan, our school has partnered with Real Schools.

Essentially, Real Schools work hand-in-hand with our school across three years to implement Restorative Practices as the underpinning methodology of our School Culture. Our approach to Restorative Practice is an upgraded version of what you might be imagining and respects both the business and the busy-ness of the contemporary Australian school. Focused on "low investment, high return" changes that trigger both quick wins and sustainable practice commitments, what we call 'RP2.0' is a revolution in teacher practice and cultural leadership. This is no 'program'—it's a commitment to your school's preferred future.

One of the first changes we've been making is to become more conscious about the language we use to create an environment where kids can grow and thrive. What the research on school culture (and that also applies to classroom culture) shows is that it's the language we, as adults, use that is the most influential factor.

And so, we've been slowly adjusting our language in four key ways.

Affective Language. We use the language of affects/feelings when speaking to the students about the low-level behaviours that happen almost all the time in schools. Instead of saying "Hey, pick that up" if a student litters, you'll hear us saying "It disappoints me to see you do that. Please pick it up". When students hear the word *disappoint*, they're not only more likely to pick up the rubbish, but they also get valuable information about that kind of behaviour that leads to better self-regulation in the future. The great part of Affective Language is that it can also be used positively to reinforce desirable behaviours by saying "I'm *delighted* to see you use the bin without being asked to". You'd be surprised at how well it works.

Stored Responses. We've been talking about how our language can get off track sometimes – at home, at school and in the big wide world – when we get flustered or emotional. We're working on storing scripted responses for those moments, so we don't lose our cool or say the wrong thing.

Positive Priming – this one's quite easy. We're trying to speak more to behaviours we want to see rather than those we'd rather not see. It's part of the reason that "don'ts don't work" all that well when it comes to working with kids. Stakeholder Protection – we want a psychologically safe classroom for kids, staff and parents. We want any possibility that you or your child will be spoken of negatively in our school to be something you couldn't even imagine happening.

In some ways, these changes seem small. *Could they really change much?* What we're finding is that they really do. We think it's got something to do with the enormous volume of opportunities we have to use these simple changes.

And you can feel very free to use these changes at home too. Try walking into a messy bedroom, nodding knowingly and just saying "This mess is pretty frustrating" before calmly walking out. See what happens next!

At Northmead PS, we are very excited about how Restorative Practices contributes to making our school one where community matters. We care for each other and the feelings generated by being a part of our school are ones that reflect a commitment to being positive, safe and friendly


Secondhand has moved to Square

This decision has been made as we have found that Square is a much easier platform for stock control, returns and exchanges.






All items on the website have been arranged into categories to help easily locate what you might be looking for.

Some items may be out of stock as available stock is only updated as donations are received. So keep your eye on the website if you are looking for something in particular.





GUESS THE WEIGHT OF THE PUMPKIN


A giant pumpkin has grown in our school vegetable garden and it could be yours!

Don't forget to submit your guess in grams via Qkr! Entries close 9am Wednesday 27th March 2024.








