SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT DAYS TERM 1: FRIDAY 28 AND MONDAY 31 JANUARY

STUDENTS IN YEARS 1-6 RETURN TUESDAY 1 FEBRUARY

Please note the beginning of 2022 school year start dates for all NSW Public Schools. To ensure that schools are able to give time to high impact professional learning for staff, the following two (2) School Development Days (SDDs) are scheduled for the beginning of the 2022 school year.

- Term 1 School Development Days Friday 28 and Monday 31 January (*no students attend*)
- Years 1-6 students return Tuesday 1 February 2022
- All 2022 Kindergarten students will have their Orientation to school and Best Start interview times between Tuesday 1 and Thursday 3 February (all parents have been informed of times). 2022 Kindergarten students do not attend Friday 4 February.
- All Northmead 2022 Kindergarten students will start in their classes on **Monday 7 February** with staggered morning arrival times being communicated with each family.

THE ROADMAP IN TERM 4 | RAPID ANTIGEN HOME TESTING (RAHT)

All NSW Public schools will operate on updated Level 3 settings for the rest of Term 4 2021, with the following activities allowed in a COVID-safe manner:

- Excursions are allowed outdoors (and indoors where sole use of the premises is available).
- Incursions are allowed indoors and outdoors where cohorts are kept separate.
- Year 6 graduations and formals are allowed within cohorts, either on school sites or at external venues with COVID-safe plans in place and physical distancing adhered to.
- School sports are allowed, including inter-school sports (<u>after school hours</u>) and access to indoor and outdoor pools (from 1 November).
- Transitions and orientations are allowed in a COVID-safe way that minimises mingling between students and follows the school's organisation.

In order to minimise disruptions caused to schools by COVID-19 cases, and to maximise the time our students have learning in the classrooms a number of changes to operations for schools will be introduced from Monday 29 November for the remainder of Term 4.

Rapid antigen 'test-to-stay' program

A rapid antigen home testing (RAHT) 'test-to-stay' program will be available to any student who is a close contact of a COVID-19 case in a school setting. This will enable them to get back to school immediately following a negative PCR test and on the basis, they do daily RAHTs before attending school across 7 consecutive days.

This means that our students' learning is able to continue with minimal interruptions following a positive COVID-19 case. Full support will be available to help you implement this should it be required at our school and many other schools and students are already using RAHTs successfully.

10 Transition Tips for 2022

As this year draws to a close, many families are probably thinking about 2022 and what it will bring for their child/children. Here are a few ideas which may assist you to prepare your child for next year.

 Start with a great holiday! Enjoy the festive season with your family and get everyone outside for some rest and recreation whether that be swimming, hiking, beach visits or playing backyard cricket.



- 2. Talk positively about the coming year. Instead of "you might not be with your friends" try " you will have a great opportunity to make new friends to add to your current friends". Instead of "you will have to get to know your new teacher" try "your new teacher is going to love having such a great mathematician/reader/friend in their class".
- 3. Listen to your child if they express concerns but talk with them about solutions to their worries. Acknowledge their fears but do not enable them.
- 4. Reduce screen time towards the end of the holidays in preparation for school and try some physical activities instead to get those "brain cells working".




- 5. Make sure your child gets plenty of sleep 9 to 11 hrs is recommended. School holidays are a time to stay up later and have some fun but, as the new school year gets closer, re-establish regular bed times.
- 6. Towards the end of January start arranging some "play dates" with friends to get your child practising their social skills in readiness for school where turn taking, sharing and negotiation are key skills to success.
- 7. Involve your child in "back to school shopping" for lunch boxes, school shoes, school supplies etc. Make sure your children "wear in" those school shoes before the big day!



- 8. For our new kinder students, make sure they get some practice getting their uniform on and their shoes as well. Maybe do a couple of walks past the school and talk about the fun they will have on the other side of that fence!
- 9. For those who are reluctant to part with mum and dad you could try giving them something special of yours to "keep" during the day (make sure it is small) a beach pebble or shell you collected together, a special keyring that could go on their bag etc. This could help them cope with the transition away from home and known adults.
- 10. Get out and about with your family museums, beaches, the movies (covid permitting), restaurants/cafes etc to get everyone back to socialising with others and being in larger groups of people. Make some wonderful family memories so your child will have some adventures to share with their teacher and their friends when they return to school.

Finally, if you have any concerns about your child's transition to 2022 don't hesitate to speak with us! Have a wonderful break and we look forward to seeing you back in 2022.
