

SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT DAYS TERM 1: FRIDAY 28 AND MONDAY 31 JANUARY

STUDENTS IN YEARS 1-6 RETURN TUESDAY 1 FEBRUARY

Please note the beginning of 2022 school year start dates for all NSW Public Schools. To ensure that schools are able to give time to high impact professional learning for staff, the following two (2) School Development Days (SDDs) are scheduled for the beginning of the 2022 school year.

- Term 1 School Development Days Friday 28 and Monday 31 January (no students attend)
- Years 1-6 students return Tuesday 1 February 2022
- All 2022 Kindergarten students will have their Orientation to school and Best Start interview times between Tuesday 1 and Thursday 3 February (all parents have been informed of times). 2022 Kindergarten students do not attend Friday 4 February.
- All Northmead 2022 Kindergarten students will start in their classes on **Monday 7 February** with staggered morning arrival times being communicated with each family.

THE ROADMAP FOR 2022 TERM 1

Many activities which have been restricted or not allowed this term (including inter-school sports, singing and playing wind-blown musical instruments, and school camps) will return in a COVID-safe way for Term 1 2022. The NSW Department of Education will develop COVID-safe guidelines based on the latest public health advice and support schools to seek parental consent for students participating in these activities. Schools will be provided with detailed guidance for Term 1 for our communities before students return on 1 February and this will be communicated to our families as we return in Term 1.

Advice for students and staff travelling internationally

NSW Health has published guidelines for recent fully vaccinated overseas arrivals – here is the link: NSW Health guidelines for recent fully vaccinated arrivals - Fact sheets

Students

Children who are not fully vaccinated must not attend school or childcare until:

- at least 7 days after arriving in Australia;
- they have received a negative result from their day 6 test.

Unfortunately, students who leave Australia cannot be guaranteed the ability to return before the beginning of Term 1 2022. For support, call <u>DE International</u> on 1300 300 229.

Rapid antigen 'test-to-stay' program – NSW Department of Education / NSW Health requirements:

A rapid antigen home testing (RAHT) 'test-to-stay' program will be available to any student who is a close contact of a COVID-19 case <u>in a school setting</u>. This will enable them to get back to school immediately following a negative PCR test and **on the basis, they do daily RAHTs before attending school across 7 consecutive days.** This means that students' learning is able to continue with minimal interruptions following a positive COVID-19 case.
