Well, here we are already close to half-way through Term 2 with next week being Week 5! We have celebrated student achievements in their day-to-day learning and life experiences with students K-6 starting to review their goals in Literacy, Numeracy and of their own choice using the NPS SoloNoG Learning Goals framework explained in the March 31 Newsletter Students•Imagine•Next•Goal. We held the SRC Induction Ceremony to turn up the volume on student voice in the school, students participated in the Zone Cross Country, representing their school with pride and skill and students in Years 3 and 5 have completed the 2022 NAPLAN assessment. We look forward to the Athletics Carnival at Gooden Reserve on 31 May (for students 3-6 and competitive students turning 8 this year). It's been wonderful to witness student enthusiasm and commitment to fitness through the Jump Rope for Heart program, with many students already demonstrating skill and absolutely enjoying their skipping practice individually and with friends.

2022 NATIONAL SORRY DAY 26 MAY NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

On May 26, the school will recognise the annual **National Sorry Day** which acknowledges the strength of Stolen Generations Survivors and reflects on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and nation.

The first National Sorry Day was held in 1998, one year after the *Bringing Them Home* report reviewing policies which caused children to be taken from their home and communities. The school



will also recognise Reconciliation Week on Monday 30 May. Students' learning will focus on the 2022 theme "Be Brave. Make Change." and participate in learning centred around Indigenous cultures. On Monday 30 May, students may acknowledge this day by wearing clothing and/or accessories in the colours of the Aboriginal Flag: black, red and yellow.





Congratulations to Shiva in 3F who is a finalist in the 5-8 year old section of the junior Archibald art competition held annually. Shiva drew a portrait of his uncle as a wedding present, as his uncle had recently been married. Shiva's detailed and emotive drawing was chosen out of 2400 entries with only 70 selected as

IMPORTANT TO KNOW WHAT'S AHEAD @NORTHMEAD

COVID UPDATE | CLOSE CONTACTS

I have updated families last Friday on recent COVID-19 cases in the school. It is important that we remain aware that COVID remains within our communities and as we head to the winter flu season, the importance of monitoring and acting on any symptoms. Close contacts must follow the guidelines below in addition to the NSW Health guidelines:

- must notify the school including outside of school hours care (NOOSH etc) if they are intending to return under these updated guidelines;
- take a daily rapid antigen test (RAT) and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 consecutive school days;
- no student of staff member identified as a close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including school camps;
- it is recommended for primary school students who are household contacts to wear masks at school and staff who are household contacts must wear masks; and
- any visitor to a school site who is a close contact must advise the school that they are a close contact before they come on site. These visitors should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending. They must also wear a mask indoors at all times. Schools should consider if the visit can be conducted virtually.

Please read the note sent home May 13 for full details on updated requirements around close/household contacts.

Any students who attend school who are unwell and show symptoms will be sent home to be tested.

STUDENT LEAVE DURING A TERM

Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations. Holidays taken by students outside of school vacation periods are included as absences. Schools understand that particularly during COVID, many families were prevented from visiting family and friends overseas and also holidays were delayed.

Accepting or declining an application for leave is at the discretion of the principal. Section 14 of the Student Attendance procedures states, 'a principal should not accept a reason for travel during school term if it is not in the best interests of the student. This includes educational, social and participation reasons.'

Please note, if the period of absence is in excess of 50 days, the student may be eligible to enrol in Distance Education and a conversation around this should take place with everyone involved so options for continuity of education are considered.
