A mutually proactive communication relationship with your child's class teacher is so important to ensuring they are thriving with their wellbeing and academic progress. You can always contact your child's class teacher to discuss any concerns but please use the school email address or contact the office and ask that the teacher contacts you. Teachers cannot discuss your child's progress or your concerns as they are taking students into class or at the end of the school day unless you have made a prior appointment. 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#### IMPORTANT TO KNOW WHAT'S AHEAD @NORTHMEAD

#### ON TIME AND IN LINES @9! EVERY MINUTE COUNTS AND EVERY DAY MATTERS!

#### <u>AT N.P.S. ARRIVE @9 ON TIME 4LINES</u>

Please have your child arrive at school **at the latest by 8:55am**. Arriving after 9:00am is disruptive for your child's learning and class morning routines. Being on time sets them up in a positive way for their day's learning. Partial attendance with late arrivals/early departures is recorded for your child's attendance records. If your child arrives late or needs to leave early, you need to go to the school office to sign your child in or out and explain the reason for the absence.

- \* When you child misses just 10 minutes a day that equals 50 minutes of learning each week which is nearly 1 and a half weeks per year. That equals nearly half a year of school K-12;
- Missing just 20 minutes a day equals 1 hour and 40 minutes of learning each week which is nearly 2/and a half weeks per year;



#### ON TIME AND IN LINES @9! EVERY MINUTE COUNTS:[CONTINUED]

- \* When you child misses just 30 minutes/day that is half a day of learning a week and adds up to nearly 4 weeks in the year;
- \* When you child misses just 1 hour each day that is 1 whole day of learning/week which is

nearly a term in that year! Your child's best learning time is at the beginning of the day. PLEASE BE ON TIME BEFORE 9am EVERYDAY!

#### EVERYDAY HEALTHCARE FOR YOUR CHILD

- Ensure medications that need to be administered by office staff (including Ventolin, epipens, antihistamines such as Claratyne) have a valid use by date. Daily prescription medications are required to be in a blister pack, that your local chemist can provide;
- All Student Health Care Plans where applicable must be valid and current. In 2022 some students had out-of-date medication notifications. If your child's Health Care Plan is not current (such as Anaphylaxis and Asthma) your child cannot attend school until it is updated by your Dr. This is a Health and Safety Issue

What to wear: On the day children are encouraged to wear something orange with their uniform as that is the official colour of Harmony Day. For example: an orange t-shirt, ribbon, hat, socks.

**Cultural Dress:** Children may like to wear clothing that represents their cultural background. They could wear all or part of it (must wear closed in shoes).

#### **NAPLAN 2023**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

From 2023, NAPLAN is moving to Term 1 and will take place from **Wednesday 15 March** to **Monday 27 March**. The reason for this change is so that results can be returned to schools earlier in the year which will support teachers to understand the learning needs of their students and plan accordingly.

NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling.

In preparation for NAPLAN 2023, our school will undertake activities to help students to become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked.

Students and parents can access the <u>public demonstration site</u> (<u>https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</u>) to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN and the types of questions and tools available. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.
